DRAFT YAMPA RIVER STRUCTURAL MASER PLAN REVIEW

The City of Steamboat Springs Parks, Open Space and Recreational Services Department and Ecological Resource Consultants are continuing work on the Yampa River Structural Master Plan with a DRAFT available for public review. The Structural Master Plan will take the next steps using the goals identified in the 2004 Yampa River Management Plan and define specific improvements that can be made to the river channel and the adjacent riparian corridor to improve the health of the river and the recreation occurring on it. To date, the work completed includes:

- Survey of existing conditions on all City owned portions of the Yampa River.
- Identification and evaluation of all man made river structures, riparian vegetation, river access points, bank stability and overall river functions.
- A comparison of existing conditions on the Yampa River and the existing goals for the use and management of the River.
- Using the inventory of existing conditions on the Yampa River, solutions have been proposed for identified areas of concern and a possible prioritization plan has been presented.

We are seeking your input on the DRAFT Master Plan as we move forward with a goal of adoption of the Master Plan. STEAMBOAT SPRINGS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSESSMENT- 2008

Economic & Planning Systems (EPS) will be presenting a report on a Steamboat Springs Economic Development Assessment at the Tuesday, March 11 City Council Meeting.

EPS was hired by the City in 2007 to complete this study and community survey to document economic base, review and analyze trends and existing conditions including retail sales patterns and demands, and City fiscal structure including trends in major revenue sources and expenditures. The presentation will ask questions of City Council to direct EPS in the final phase of the project to develop a strategy to address economic challenges.
