Council etc., Re: City Managers Report for 1/9/2018 in regards to the possible elimination of the bike lane on Yampa Street. Watching the Yampa Street project in relation to bikes was really frustrating. If the parking issue at that one area are not corrected, please engage with the cycling community to ensure they are on board with the proposed changes. I personally think that consistency along the whole street is one of the most important parts that Yampa is missing. During discussions with Jack and Mary Brown as the project was still being initially implemented, one option was to eliminate the bike lanes on the whole street and go with a large sharrow with "bikes may use full lane" like other communities are using. It is potentially a safe option for all involved. Especially considering the lack of current consistency along that street in relation to bike lanes. Also, the now completed PUD at Riverview that did not include bike lanes or a trail through their property. Please do three things before moving forward with a removal of any bike related infrastructure: 1) reach out to Routt County Riders to gather input and suggestions. 2) Consider "bikes may use full lane" model that other areas are using to increase safety (reduces the risk of being "doored" & would increase the consistency and therefore safety on Yampa Street). 3) Post a notice like planning projects do adjacent to the bike lane you are considering to remove on Yampa Street to ensure that the users are aware of the potential changes. RE: Planning Commission Report

Planning Commission met on December 18, 2017 for a Policy work session.

Staff presented the "Planning and Development Policy Priorities", which prioritized 27 topics to be worked on in the coming days/months/years.

Included in this document is "proposed timeline for High priorities" for 2018, including PC final authority, Residential in Industrial zone, waterbody setbacks, Sign Code, residential densities and the downtown plan.

Commissioners did not make any changes to the proposed plans.

We also had a discussion about the "Zucker Rreport". If there was meaningful consensus we would offer a more influential joint statement. No consensus was found. Our discussion did bring a better understanding of the report, staff reactions and next steps.
