PARKING RESTRICTIONS

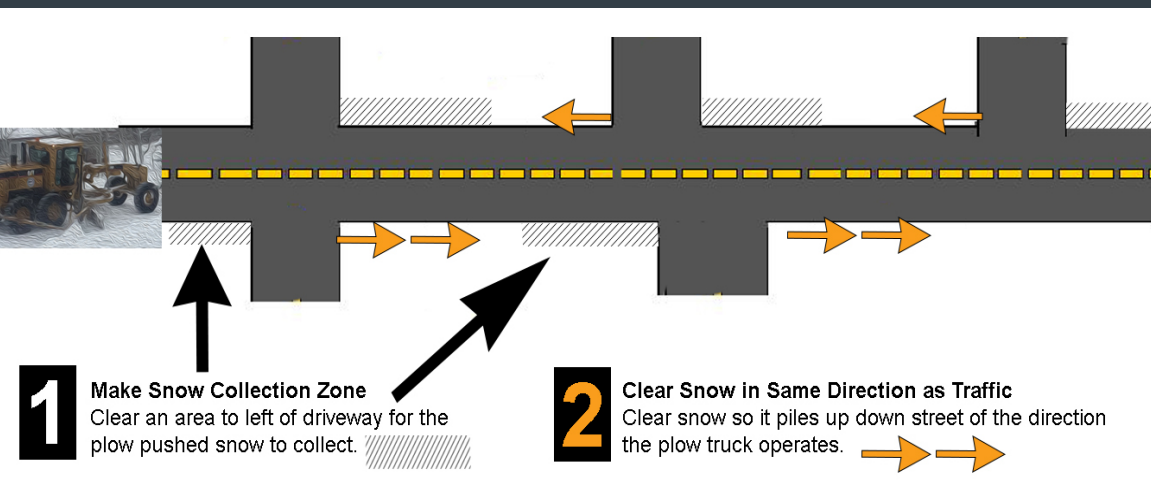
Winter parking is prohibited on city streets and shoulders from Nov. 1 to April 30 as follows:

Lincoln Avenue	3am to 6am
Ski Time Square	3am to 6am
Anglers Drive	12am to 8am
City Limits South	12am to 8am
All Other Areas	2am to 8am

Vehicles left on streets during this time may be ticketed and/or towed

SNOW SMART

11 SAND TRUCKS & MOTOR GRADERS

operate on city streets during snowstorms.

Street snow plowing operations cover 160 lane miles of streets, 6 miles of alleys, nearly 50 parking lots and 106 cul-de-sacs utilizing 5 motor graders, 6 sand trucks & 2 loaders, operated over two shifts by 20 full-time and seasonal employees.

An average of 2,800 tons of scoria annually is used to improve traction on city streets. Scoria is a dark-colored igneous rock with abundant round bubble-like cavities known as vesicles.
