Councilors Are All Ears At Summer Long Farmers Market Booth

**STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-June 5, 2025-** The Steamboat Springs Farmers Market is more than a place to shop—it's a place to connect. Starting Saturday, June 7, Steamboat Springs City Council will once again host a booth at the market, offering residents a relaxed and accessible space to share thoughts, ask questions, and talk about what matters most.

“One of the City Council’s key priorities is being available to the community,” said City Council President Gail Garey. “The Farmers Market booth gives us a valuable opportunity to hear directly from residents and engage in meaningful conversations about our city’s future.”

From 9 am to noon each Saturday, available council members will be on hand at the corner of 7<sup>th</sup> & Yampa to chat about city issues, listen to feedback, and provide updates on projects and initiatives. The City Manager is also frequently present to join the conversation.

Throughout the summer, the booth will also welcome special guests, such as department directors or public safety officials, giving residents an opportunity to learn more about how local government works and who’s working on their behalf. In addition, Steamboat Springs Fire Rescue and Steamboat Springs Police Department will be conducting sidewalk CPR education during the market.



“The booth has become a cornerstone for community connection,” said City Manager Tom Leeson. “It’s a simple but effective way for residents to be heard, ask questions, and feel more involved in local decisions.”

The Farmers Market runs 9am–2pm every Saturday from June 7 through September 20 and closes Yampa Street between 6<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Streets, including 7<sup>th</sup> from Lincoln Avenue to Yampa. With over 150 vendors offering everything from fresh produce and baked goods to handmade treasures, there’s something for everyone including catching up with friends and neighbors.
