



## **Celebrate July 4<sup>th</sup> Across the Yampa Valley**

### Night Drone Show Returns to Light Up Fourth at Steamboat Ski Resort

**STEAMBOAT SPRINGS, COLORADO-July 1, 2025**-The Annual Cowboys Roundup Days' Fourth of July Parade returns to Lincoln Avenue/US40 this year when floats roll down main street on Friday, July 4, 2025. In addition to traditional holiday events, the night will light up with the return of the evening synchronized drone show at the Steamboat Ski Resort.

"The Fourth of July in Steamboat Springs is more than a celebration of national pride; it's an opportunity to honor the Yampa Valley's rich heritage," said Steamboat Springs Chamber CEO Sarah Leonard. "The Chamber is proud to produce the parade, and with so many activities around the community, there is something for everyone to enjoy."

July 4<sup>th</sup> planned events will have residents and visitors proclaiming independence at this holiday celebration and include to name a few:



- Lion's Club Pancake Breakfast – Little Toots Park @ 7am
- Nordic Combined 1K Run – Lincoln Ave @ 9:15am
- 3K Roller Ski Race – Lincoln Ave @ 9:30am
- July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade – Lincoln Ave between 10<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> Streets @ 10am
- Jumpin' & Jammin' – Howelsen Hill immediately following parade
- MarchFourth Free Concert, Steamboat Ski Resort @ 7pm
- Pro Rodeo Series, Brent Romick Arena @ 7:30am
- Drone Show, Steamboat Ski Resort @ 9pm

The traffic plan will use a circular configuration that sees US40 eastbound traffic diverted onto Yampa Street and US40 westbound traffic onto Oak Street during the daytime downtown events. The city is working with a traffic control company to run the detour including signage, barriers, and flaggers at key intersections.

If driving, downtown parking is available at Howelsen Hill Ski Area, Howelsen Ice Complex, Rodeo Arena, Stockbridge Transit Center, or the high school. Please respect residential access and do not block driveways. Due to the high volume of anticipated spectators, please be patient, alert and follow traffic control signage and directions.

The city encourages people to walk, bike or take the free SST bus, which will see additional buses running during the parade. SST will be dropping passengers off at the Gondola Transportation Center (GTC) that evening for the drone show. The Steamboat Ski Resort will operate shuttles from the Meadows Parking Lot. The majority of events are free to attend but please leave pets at home.
