During the presentation, city leadership will provide an overview of key accomplishments from 2025 and share updates on major projects currently underway.

The discussion will also focus on City Council’s priorities, including continued progress on diverse housing solutions, transportation and mobility, fiscal sustainability and financial stewardship, environmental sustainability, community engagement and public outreach, as well as strengthening partnerships that support Steamboat Springs’ long-term success.
